FRIDAY, JULY 5, 19, & 26, 11AM LITTLE EXPLORERS

SATURDAY, JULY 6, 2PM GUIDED HIKE | REGISTRATION REQUIRED RED, WHITE AND BLUEBERRY HIKE

SUNDAY, JULY 7, 10:30AM & 1:30PM WORKSHOP | REGISTRATION + FEE NATURE'S MEDICINE CABINET

Did you know that willows contain salicin, nature's aspirin? While Devil's Club may not be a hiker's friend, it has long been valued as medicine. Knowledge of local medicinal plants can be helpful for emergencies in the back-country and at home. While not intended as medical advice, this class concentrates on plant identification, processing plant materials and how to make infusions, tinctures and salves. *This is a two-part workshop: a morning walk (\$30 fee, 10am-12pm) and an afternoon hands-on class (\$55 fee, 1:30pm-4pm). SUNDAY, JULY 21, 2PM GUIDED HIKE | REGISTRATION REQUIRED DENA'INA LANDSCAPES

Nuk'elehitnu (Eagle River) is located in Dena'ina Elnena, the traditional territory of the Dena'ina people. This program explores the indigenous landscape of South Central Alaska. After a short introduction in the education yurt, we will hit the Rodak Trail and explore Dena'ina people's knowledge of the flora and fauna of their landscape. This hike is led by Ivan Hodes -- a former educator and life-long outdoor enthusiast who has been exploring the indigenous landscape of South Central Alaska for 18 years. *Register at www.ernc.org/ public-programs.*

THURSDAY, JULY 25, IPM-3PM JUNIOR NATURALIST | OPEN HOUSE THE SCOOP ON POOP

Scat, dung, spore, droppings. Whatever you want to call it, everybody poops. Scat can be a useful tool for scientists to discover which creatures are in a certain area and what they're eating. Try your hand at scat ID, learn about the bathroom habits of different creatures and more down in the education yurt.

SATURDAY, JULY 27, 1PM-3PM JUNIOR NATURALIST | OPEN HOUSE CREEK CRITTERS

Meet on the lower Albert Loop bridges to discover what lies beneath the creek—caddisfly larvae, midges, even predaceous diving beetles! Bring extra clothes and boots and plan to get wet while filling a menagerie with macroinvertebrates, plus learn what some familiar bugs look like when they're young.

SUNDAY, JULY 28, 11AM GUIDED HIKE | REGISTRATION REQUIRED FAREWELL TO THE ALBERT LOOP HIKE!

As soon as the salmon return to our end of Eagle River, we close the Albert Loop to give the bears space to feast in peace...Assuming the salmon haven't returned by July 28, we know that they'll be back soon! Take one last look at the Albert Loop trail, investigate beaver activity and pack a picnic lunch to eat on the gravel bars in this family-friendly outing! *Register at www.ernc.org/public-programs*.
